**Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu |** Assessment information and grade criteria Assessment specifications:

Evidence of planning programmes and activities is required over a period of at least 8 weeks. Evidence must be gathered to demonstrate repeated consistent performance to fully meet the outcome and credits of this standard.

Activities must be at least 30 minutes in duration.

Programmes (a regular series of sessions) and activities must have a minimum of eight participants.

Assessment must take place in a realistic active recreation environment and in accordance with workplace requirements.

- Contingencies such as weather, equipment, funding, participant numbers, personnel.
